Subject: Weekly Media Release

Between Monday the 30th October – Sunday the 5th November 2017 the Cobourg Police Service responded to 211 calls for service including:

11 Motor vehicle collisions, 7 Alarms, 10 Thefts, 5 Assaults, 36 Community Service calls, 5 Threat calls, 23 Police assistance calls and 5 Threatening calls.

Here is a summary of the week:

October 30

- Police responded to two separate incidents of harassment over social media and in both instances the parties were cautioned by Police and advised to use better discretion.
- Police responded to an assault in the east end of Cobourg and after further investigation it was revealed that the complainant and another person were in a consensual fight with each other.

October 31

- Police attended the downtown core for a report of an assault in progress. Upon arrival and further investigation it was discovered that a female party was breaching her conditions on her probation and had an arrest warrant from Belleville Police. The male was treated at the

Northumberland Hills Hospital and later released and the female was transported to the Belleville Police Service.

- Police attended an address on the East side of Cobourg for a report of a male and a female smoking from a drug apparatus and refusing to leave the property. Police searched the area and located the two parties who had a card to possess marijuana and were cautioned on trespassing.

November 1st

- Police responded to an area laundromat for a report of a male and female that refused to leave the business after closing. Both parties were cautioned under the Trespass to Property act and after advising Police what they were going to do inside the business, they were also cautioned for criminal mischief
- Police responded to three calls for impaired drivers and all three had left the area or could not be located.

November 2nd

- Police were called to take a report of person(s) unknown that had caused damage to a U-haul truck parked on a street near the downtown.
- Police were called to a local restaurant for a report of a large tractor trailer blocking the entrance to the restaurant. The truck was gone prior to Police arrival.

- Police responded to a local hotel for a report of a male refusing to leave the hotel after being requested to do so by staff. The male had left the area prior to Police arrival.

- Police responded to a complaint of a male breaching the conditions of his release by being away from the residence alone. Police located the male who was subsequently arrested and held for a bail hearing.
 - Police responded to a local long term care facility for a report of three separate assaults from resident on resident. There will be no charges forthcoming due to the state of mind of the residents.

November 4th

- Police responded to a serious motor vehicle collision in the Northeast part of Cobourg, where a motor vehicle ran into a local business. The business was evacuated for safety purposes and there will be no charges forthcoming as it occurred on private property.
- Police attended a local business on Danforth Road for what appeared to be a swarming of a large group of people at the front gate. Upon arrival it was learned that it was a large group of geo-cachers.

November 5th

- Police responded to an address near the downtown core for a report of a possible deceased person. After further investigation it was revealed to be a person having an anxiety attack and was treated by paramedics.
- Police responded to an address near the downtown for an unknown 911 call. On arrival Police could hear the telephone ring and a faint voice. Police determined it was an emergency and breached the door to discover a female laying on the ground having a medical issue. The female was transported by paramedics to the Northumberland Hills Hospital.
